Book Synopsis: The Boys in the Boat is about nine working class boys from the state of Washington who pulled together and rowed for gold in the 1936 men's Olympic eight-oar rowing event and how they got there, especially focusing on Joe Rantz's heart rending story of how he learned to trust himself and his teammates. He was abandoned by his family at an early age and learned to fend for himself.
