Book Synopsis:In the twenty-sixth year of Augustus Caesar's reign, a young chef, Thrasius, is acquired for the exorbitant price of twenty thousand denarii. His purchaser is the infamous gourmet Marcus Gavius Apicius, wealthy beyond measure, obsessed with a taste for fine meals from exotic places, and a singular ambition: to serve as culinary advisor to Caesar, an honor that will cement his legacy as Rome's leading epicure.

As Apicius draws closer to his ultimate goal, his reckless disregard for any who might get in his way takes a dangerous turn that threatens his young family and places his entire household at the mercy of the most powerful forces in Rome.

Highlights of Discussion: The role of slaves and women in ancient Rome. Apicius' desire to be gastromic advisor to Ceasar at all cost to his family and friends. Discussed how advanced Rome was in many respects, but also the gluttony, the wealth and waste of resources. Talked about how loyal Thrasius was to Apicius in spite of his cruelty and erratic behavior. Finally, how tragic all the deaths were including Apicius ending his own life by poisoning his last meal.
