**Book Title:** Glory Over Everything

**Book Synopsis:** The story's main character, Jamie Pyke, is the son of a black slave and a white plantation owner. He was forced to flee his Virginia home to avoid being sold as a slave. The story begins in Philadelphia in 1830, where Jamie now passes as the white Mr. James Burton, an artist and silversmith. After his lover dies during childbirth, James learns that slave catchers have abducted his young servant, Pan. As a debt to Pan's father, James sets out to rescue Pan in North Carolina. With the help of a slave from his former home, and help from Underground Railroad sympathizers, James must face up to his true identity and some of his greatest fears.

**Our Review:** Everyone in attendance enjoyed the book. Some had read the author's previous novel, **The Kitchen House**, and remembered Jamie's previous life of privilege and the circumstances that forced him to flee his home.
