Book Synopsis: Leia Birch finds herself pregnant after a one-night stand with Batman at a comic-con convention. Leia is 38 and is concerned about the response from her white Southern family when she shares the news she is pregnant with a bi-racial baby. Leia doesn't break the news to her family because of extenuating family problems. She learns her 90 year old grandmother, Birchie, is suffering from a rapidly progressing form of dementia. She goes with her niece to take care of Birchie's situation in Birchville, Alabama. Once in Birchville, Leia learns her grandmother has been hiding more than her illness from her. A trunk, that had been hidden in the attic, is discovered to hold a skeleton. After Birchie and her friend Wattie try to remove the trunk from Birchie's home, the entire town becomes aware of the skeleton in the trunk. It forces the townspeople to take sides, and Leia becomes more aware of family secrets.

Our Review: Most in attendance would give the book a 4 star rating out of 5. Goodreads gave a rating of 3.98 out of 5.0, while Barnes and Noble gave a rating of 4.9 out of 5. The book was chosen by the Grand Rapids Public Library as one of their summer reads. Most of us are interested in reading Jackson's newest novel, *Never Have I Ever*.
